


A LL persons, including Lessees of grazing lands, are hereby required to take notice without authority from the Minister of the Interior, or the Local Crown Timber Agent of Dominion Lands for the District, is forbidden by law, and all timber so cut without authority is liable to seigure and to be dealt with as the Minister of the Interior may

Each settler on a homestead quarter section not having timber on it, may, on application to the Local Agent of Dominion Lands, purchase a wood lot not exceeding twenty acres in extent, at five dollars per acre. Any person other than a homestead settle desiring permission to out timber, must make

application therefor to the Minister of the Interior, who will deal with such application according to law, Persons who have already cut timber with out authority, must pay the dues thereon to the Crown Timber Agent at his office, on or said timber will be confiscated under the pro. M. BURGESS,
