

Although the weather was remarkably pleasant on the first day of the Summer meeting at this track, St. John, N.B., June 30, the attendance was not so large as had been expected. The track was in excellent order. The management was unexceptionable, and so punctually were the races run that the three events were speedily decided and the track cleared shortly after seven o'clock. The initial trot was for horses of the three-minute class, for a purse of \$150, and was won by Sharp's (Levant, Me.) runner Centennial, Henderson's gr m Panacea taking second, and Ball's o m Lady Mac third money. Time—2:47½, 2:49, 2:51½, 2:48½. The second event was for a purse of \$300, for horses of the 2:38 class. This was won by Woelden's g s Honest Farmer (Bangor, Me), in three straight heats, Slipp's b m Nellie Thorne taking second, and Kehoe's b g Ned (St Stephen) third money. Time—2:47, 2:45½, 2:41½. The third and last event was a running race for a purse of \$150. This was won by Phair's b m Sussex Lass in two straight heats, Garretty's b m Countess taking second money. On Saturday, July 1, the second day of the meeting, the weather was a scorching one, and the attendance very large. The first race was for horses of the 2:50 class, for a purse of \$150, and was won by Centennial. After the horses had been called on a protest was entered
