Lake IVinnipeg with a party of thirty girls and fifty boys be-tween the ages of eight and eighteen years, who are brought out to this country for adoption or hire, chiefly among farmers. They are expected to arrive at the Guthrie Home, near the city, on or about the 15th. This will be Mr. Middlemore's sixteenth annual visit to these shores with juvenile emigrants from Birmingham, England, since 1872. 


