

while on duty with the Commissions. The scheme came into operation from April 1, 1958 and will cost £15,221.15.5 by way of premium per year for the personnel of the three Commissions.

6. Ambassador A. Szymanowski, Representative of Poland, left on May 7, 1957 and Ambassador W. Goralski took over on July 15, 1957 as Representative of Poland. During the interval Mr. J. Goldblat acted as Representative of Poland.

In paragraph 5 of the Seventh Interim Report, a reference was made to the complaints from the Royal Cambodian Government alleging border incidents and threats of violation of Cambodian territory by the troops of the Republic of Viet-Nam. During the period under review, the International Commission for Supervision and Control in Cambodia forwarded to this Commission copies of some fresh complaints of similar nature received directly by it and copies of some complaints sent directly to the Government of the Republic of Viet-Nam by the Royal Government of Cambodia. The Commission considered these and forwarded the former to the Government of the Republic of Viet-Nam for information, expressing the hope that direct communications and negotiations on the subject which the two Governments were having would lead to amicable settlement in all these cases. The Government of the Republic of Viet-Nam replied that the requests of the Royal Government of Cambodia have always been considered with the greatest care, and the findings of the enquiries communicated directly and in due time to the Royal Government.
