The Passport Office uses the following indicators of efficiency to measure its success: volume, productivity, revenue and expenditures.

## VOLUME

The demand for passports is primarily a function of demographics, economic factors and weather in Canada as well as the political climate in travel destinations. The demand for passports obtained for imminent travel is fairly stable and can be forecast through the various demographic trends and travel statistics. Some fluctuations occur in this category as a result of changes in airlines' requirements for travel or countries' requirements for entry. When a passport is acquired for "just-in-case" purposes or as symbol of Canadian identity, demand is less stable and can be affected by factors such as the cost of obtaining
