EXCELLENCY,

I have the honour to refer to the Agreement between the Government of Canada and the Government of the Federal Republic of Germany for Cooperation in the Peaceful Uses of Atomic Energy signed at Ottawa December 11 last, and in particular to Paragraph 1 of Article VII therein which provides as follows:

"The present Agreement shall be brought into force through an exchange of Notes to that effect."

I have the honour to propose that the Agreement be now brought into force and that this Note and your reply to that effect shall constitute an exchange of Notes for the purpose of Paragraph 1 of Article VII. If this proposal is acceptable to your Government I suggest further that the Agreement enter into force on the date of your reply.
