Allan Ezra Gotlieb

Mr. Gotlieb was born in Winnipeg on February 28, 1928. After obtaining his E. A. degree from the University of California in 1949, Mr. Gotlieb was a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford where he received his BCL and MA degrees in 1953 and 1954. He also graduated from Harvard University in 1954 with an LL.B degree. He was on The Board of Editors of the Harvard Law Review in 1951-52 and became a Barrister of The Inner Temple in 1956. From 1954 to 1956, Mr. Gotlieb was a Vinerian Law Scholar and Fellow of Wadham College and University Lecturer in Law at Oxford. He is the author of "Disarmament and International Law" and has published many articles in the field of internation law. Mr. Gotlieb was a Special Lecturer on the Legal Aspects of Disarmament at Queen's University in 1965 and has been Visiting Professor of Political Science at Carleton University since 1966.

Mr. Gotlieb joined the Department of External Affairs in 1957 and has since served in Ottawa and Geneva. He became a member of the Canadian Delegation to the Eighteen-Nation Disarmament Conference in 1962. He returned to Ottawa in 1964 and was appointed Head of the Legal Division on October 4, 1965.
