## PRAYERS.

Pursuant to Standing Order 39(4), the following three Questions were made Orders of the House for Returns, namely:

No. 1,342—*Mr. Rhéaume*

1. For each of the fiscal years from 1953-54 to 1963-64, what were the number of (a) low-cost houses (b) welfare houses, built by government in the Northwest Territories for (i) Eskimos (ii) Indians (iii) others?
2. What is the number of houses in each of category (a) and (b) above and for groups (i), (ii), and (iii) above planned for each of the fiscal years 1964-65 and 1965-66?

1. Has the government received representations asking it to establish a quota requiring employers to hire a certain percentage of disabled persons and, if so (a) from whom were such representations received (b) when were they received (c) briefly, what was the nature of these representations, and (d) what was the government's response to them?
2. What types of financial assistance does the government supply in the field of rehabilitation, and what were the totals for 1961 and 1962?
3. Has the government received requests for such financial assistance to be increased and, if so, from whom were such requests received?
