We have also repeatedly expressed the opinion that we should plan our sessions, set both the starting and closing dates, in order to enable the members, which I think is quite legitimate, to spend some time with their families throughout the year. We have suggested it in the past and I do so again: we should try as much as possible to plan our work so that it fits in with the school year.

To my mind, the government should make an effort towards that aim and parties could agree amongst themselves about programming our work for the session in that way. Mr. Speaker, I take this opportunity to bring up again a very interesting suggestion that would spare us a considerable waste of time in our work, that is, that general elections be held on a set date. I draw the attention of the Deputy Prime Minister and President of Privy Council (Mr. MacEachen) on that point, so that we might study it very seriously in every party. We are all here to manage as best we can the business of this country, and the suspense that always accompanies the possibility of a general election always plays havoc with the normal course of our work. I feel that we should, like intelligent people, reflect on those two matters: namely, a set date for general elections, and set dates for our sessions. If we could agree on them like intelligent people, we would give the country, I am sure, a more efficient administration, and the people would be very pleased with our decisions.
