EDUCATION STATISTICS

Question No. 1,833—Mr. Herbert:

In the last year, what percentage of (a) grade school (b) high school children studied their second official language?

Hon. J.-J. Blais (Minister of Supply and Services): Statistics Canada reports: in the 1979-80 school year, 44.8 per cent of elementary school children and 40.8 per cent of secondary school children in the nine provinces outside Quebec studied French as a second language. In Quebec, 37.0 per cent of elementary school children and 98.0 per cent of secondary school children studied English as a second language. It is important to note that the figures above are based on eligible students only. In Quebec, English and French students enrolled in English immersion education are excluded, as are students enrolled in French immersion education in the other provinces.

BUSINESS OF THE HOUSE

TIME ALLOCATION FOR SECOND READING OF BILL C-59

Hon. Yvon Pinard (President of Privy Council) moved:

That in relation to Bill C-59, an act to provide for supplementary borrowing authority, one additional sitting day shall be allotted to the further consideration of second reading stage of the bill; and that at 15 minutes before the expiry of the time provided for government business on that day, any proceedings before the House shall be interrupted, if required, for the purpose of this order and, in turn, every question then necessary in order to dispose of second reading stage of the bill shall be put forthwith and successively, without further debate or amendment.

He said: Madam Speaker, this is a motion under Standing Order 75c which we were forced to introduce because we could not reach agreement with the opposition parties to allocate a definite period of time to conclude the debate on second reading of the bill to authorize the government to
