RULE 7.—It shall be the duty of the critic to criticise the proceedings of the whole literary session; and in doing so he shall not occupy more than ten minutes.

RULE 8.—In the executive session unfinished business must always have the precedence.

RULE 9.—Every resolution and report of committee brought before the Society shall be submitted in writing.

RULE 10.—No speaking, except that provided for in the Order of Exercises, shall be in order unless a motion or resolution is before the meeting. It may be permitted at times by courtesy, if not objected to by any of the members.

RULE 11.—On motions or resolutions of business, the time of each speaker shall be limited to five minutes at one time, and he shall be permitted to speak to the same motion but twice.

RULE 12.—Each speaker shall confine his remarks to the subject under consideration.

Rule 13.—The parliamentary rules laid down in Cushing's Manual shall be authority in all cases not included above.
