**OCTOBER WAS LOWER** 

OTTAWA, Nov. 7.—(Can. Press.)—Details of the government financial statement show that Canada's revenue in the first seven months of the fiscal year totals \$101.103.314, which is about \$5,000,000 greater than in the same period of last year.

Consol dated account expenditure showed a slight increase to \$57,446.828 and capital expenditure was \$30,720,490 or about double that of the first seven months last year, due principally to the \$13,000,000 of railway subsidies.

Revenue for October was \$14,225,598, about half a million under that of October, 1912. October expenditure increased by a million and a quarter to \$8,749,937.
