A button pressed by the president of France, in Paris, will raise the tri-color, while when President Wilson touches another button at the White House in Washington, the stars and stripes will be hoisted.

It was stated by the secretary of the builders' exchange that builders would sign a contract for the present season at the old rates, but would not consider the increase until next year. The secretary of the union declared that the men had no alternative but strike should the masters refuse the demand for an increased wage. As was pointed out in The World exclusively, the strike will involve 1900 bricklayers and masons, and it is expected that every man will turn out to express his views at the special meeting on Tuesday.

SEATTLE, Wash., May 15.—The discovery of a gang of international counterfeiters became known today when it was made public that United States secret service operatives seized a counterfeiting plant at Seattle, valued at \$3000. Detectives are working on clues concerning the identity of the men who have been operating in Western Washington and British Columbia and eastward thruout Canada as far as Ottawa. The counterfeiters have been Ottawa. The counterfeiters have been turning out twenty-dollar Canadian bank notes and Canadian five-dollar bills, and secret service men estimate that at least \$10,000 of this money has been issued on the Pacific coast in the last six months.




