

FAT CATTLE EQUAL TO LOCAL DEMAND

Moderate Receipts, But Plenty for Toronto Trade at Present.

PRICE HAS INCREASED

Compared With Thursday Advance is Ten to Fifteen Cents:

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards on Monday, June 14, 1915, comprising 1705 cattle, 1483 hogs, 138 sheep and lambs, 135 calves and 212 horses, all well watered and rested in transit for the British army.

Receipts of fat cattle were moderate, compared with those of a week ago, but the equal to the demands.

The fat cattle were in good condition, and the prices were higher than on Thursday, as will be seen by the comparison of values paid on the two days.

Stocks and feeders were not in much demand, and values were unchanged.
