and extended researches; and the Athenseum, taking a sufficiency of time for the purpose, and applying to the task the varied information and experience, and the energy and application of its various members, might produce such a full and reliable account of the condition, resources, trade and prospects of Carleton, as would place it before the world in the position to which by the richness of its natural resources, the development of its industry, and the intelligence and enterprise of its people, it is justly entitled. Such a work would be of immense benefit to the County, and would worthily employ the labors of our young but spirited association.
