WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family, or any mate over it years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitobs, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any agency, on certain conditions by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Duties.—Six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each or three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a tarm of at least so acres solely owned and oscapied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$3.00 per acre.

Duties.—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption six months in each of six years from date of homestead entry including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres extra.
