AN ACT RESPECTING TELEPHONE COMPANIES. His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Telephone Companies Act." 2. In this Act unless the context otherwise requires the expression "The Company" means a company incorporated by letters patent under the Companies Act or under any private act of the Dominion of Canada for the

purpose of constructing a line or lines of telephones in Canada. 2. The word "tolls" in this Act shall apply not only to the rates charged for rental or use of telephones but also to charges for messages from any per. sion.
