CZAR GROWS HUMANE.

es Away With Castigation With Judgments and Other Barbarities.

St. Petersburg, July 15.—The Blizaria Vedemost says that the Czar has abolished the harshest remnants the barbaric punishments of former times, namely, castigation with whips, and cat-o-nine-tails, chaining the car and shaving the head, which were inflicted on certain classes of persons exiled to penal settlements to the mines. This form of punishment frequently ended in death by torture.

The cudgel and the "cat" are retained in the new statute, says the newspaper, by prolongation of term or solitary confinement up to one hundred days, with bread and water, except on every third day, when hot food will be served at one meal. The revised statute of July 15 prescribes gagging with birch rods up to 100 blows "for slight offences, and misdemeanors."

ORANGEMEN OF W.-L.D.

Dublin, July 15.—(News cable.)—The annual conference of the Imperial and Orange Council of the world convened here to-day for the first time. Dr. W. Bro. David Ingram of New York, who was supported by Earl of Erne, John Accullin of the Orange Order of West of Ireland, who replied on behalf of the Canadian delegates, spoke well, and made a most favorable impression upon the assembly.
