# FOCH'S TROOPS MAKE ADVANCE OF THREE MILES

French Sweep Along in Picardy Sector, Taking Many Positions.

PARIS, July 12.—French troops attacked over a front of approximately three miles between Castel and north of Mailly-Raineval (in the Picardy sector) this morning, according to the war office statement issued tonight. The villages of Castel, the Anchin farm and a number of strong German positions were taken and about 500 prisoners captured. The attack penetrated the German lines to a depth of more than a mile.

A SUPERB OPERATION.

On the French Front in France, Friday, July 12.—The superbly executed local actions carried out by the French today southeast of Amiens, not only gave them a large batch of prisoners, but brought into their possession the entire Recouvrelles plateau dominating the region between the Rivers Avre and Moreuil and the Noye, through which the main railroad from Paris to Amiens passes, and which has been in the hands of the enemy since March.
