

sions. In this we aid the great work of the world's evangelisation, inasmuch as, to the full extent of our operations, we relieve the men and means of other churches to go to foreign work, without violence to Home interests. And verily God has smiled upon us and vouchsafed us great success. New and important openings in England are being successfully occupied by the Parent Society; while the progress of our cause in Australia has astonished our most sanguine friends, and, in some instances, proved a difficulty in supplying all the men and means necessary; but the stand taken by our people in that important British dependency, reflects credit upon the Denomination, and demands gratitude to Him without whose blessing we labor in vain.

Owing to the new financial arrangement bearing heavily upon Circuits, it was feared that our Missionary receipts this year would be much reduced, and, to make the prospect still worse, the year 1870 was one of very short crops and low prices. Our adherents being largely of the farming population, we trembled for the result. Notwithstanding these difficulties, our receipts are really ahead of any previous year.

A very brief summary of the result of Missionary operations during the year, prosecuted by means of your liberality, and our work will be done.

CLINTON is reported in advance of its standing at any former period. With a deepening interest, a good Sunday School, a working Church, and an efficient ministry, the town cause would become a most flourishing one. The Parsonage debt has been cancelled.

COLBORNE reports an increase of members, resulting from a gracious revival. A new appointment has been taken up and a large class formed there. A destitute neighborhood cries for help, which, however, cannot be fully attended to, as the field is already too large for one minister to work efficiently. The societies are living in peace, finances ahead, and chapel repairs and improvements reported.

In FENELON, a new appointment has been taken up. The Mission is steadily progressing. A liberal expenditure has improved some, and freed from debt other churches. A gracious revival at the Falls has led to an enlarged society and congregation in the village. They contemplate building a Parsonage.

GREY is hopeful; but needs a young, active and devoted Missionary, to lead the Church forward in its work. There appears to be ample material, and a prospect of occupying new ground to advantage.

HUNGERFORD has sustained large loss in members by removals and unfaithfulness; but has gained financially. The labor-
