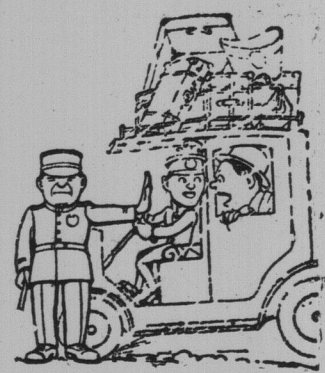
**Chilcoat May Not**

**Start In M. & M.**

**Wrenched His Hind Leg When**

**Forced Over a Harrow**

It is doubtful if Chilcoat, a fast trot-  
ter owned by C. A. Burns of Toronto  
will be a starter in the M. & M. stake  
at Detroit this week. Chilcoat met with  
an accident at North Randall on July  
man, who always likes to, and has win-  
ners, refused to part with the horse, and  
it is rather hard luck on his part that  
misfortune should set in so early in the  
season.  
According to the veteran Ed. Geers,  
who has been at North Randall all  
spring, Chilcoat is the fastest son that  
the great sire San Francisco ever had,  
while he was thought so highly of at  
Cleveland this week, despite the ac-  
cident, that he sold favorite in the pools  
at \$200 to \$300.  
The accident that happened to Chilcoat  
was similar to the one that put the ve-  
teran Ed Geers in the hospital last year  
at the same track. On this day Nat  
Ray had worked Chilcoat a mile in  
2:07 1/2, with the last half in 1:02 and the  
last quarter in 30 1/2 seconds. He was  
working out another heat when the har-  
rows were on the track. He turned out  
to avoid them, but other horses work-  
ing the wrong way of the track came  
along, and Nat was forced to drive  
right over the harrows. The result was  
that Chilcoat gave his hind leg a bad  
wrench, while the spectators say it is a  
wonder that both the driver and horse  
were not killed. Since that time until  
this week Nat has not worked him, as he  
was anxious to give the horse all the  
rest possible. It is understood that  
his owner is thinking seriously of  
scratching him out of the M. & M. and

**IS USEFUL ACCESSORY**

For the telephone user in a noisy of-  
fice, a sound amplifier of compact and
