

SAINT JOHN GETS MEDITERRANEAN SHIP SERVICE

Valfiora to Inaugurate Sailings in January, Says Agent

PIER WITH 2 MORE BERTHS CALLED FOR

Shipping People Want Action for Preventing Boat Delays

MONTREAL, Oct. 30.—Saint John is to get another steamship service.

A. L. Laws, of the Lloyd Mediterranean Italian service, informed me today that the steamship Valfiora, which has sailed from Montreal for the Mediterranean, will go to Saint John in January, and inaugurate a winter service from that port. He added that he had received evidence of my canvass of importers in letters enquiring about the service.

The steamship people here have held several meetings in relation to Saint John with a view to such co-operation as will prevent delays in the movements of vessels this winter. Their verdict is that a pier providing two additional berths must be provided before the winter of 1926-27, and they will communicate with the City Council and back its efforts to secure them.

here and in Toronto, I am sure Saint John will not lack strong support in this matter. I asked President Beatty where he thought the first new pier should be constructed and he said it should be built wherever it can be done most quickly and at least cost. There can be doubt about the feeling here that winter business will grow at Saint John and that the needed facility should be provided for the winter of 1926-27.

Thomas Robb of the Shipping Federation said the people of Saint John deserved support because they had spent their own money freely and had labored under difficulties in getting the port equipped. Of the weekly Cuban service, the Star tonight says:

"The first sailing will be from Saint John about November 20. Thereafter, sailings will be made every two days. One of the most important effects of this route, according to official information obtained today, is that it will open up a new sphere for Canadian manufacturers' products, while it will also ensure to Canada supplies of Cuba's sugar brought in direct through Canadian ports, and consignments of fruit, which, hitherto, have been brought in via American ports."
