Dublin Denies Idea of Handing Over Free State to De Valera

SENSATIONAL LONDON REPORT IS RIDICULED

Daily Mail Carries Story That Free State Cabinet Ready to Resign

TREATY IN JEOPARDY Boundary Commission Issues Invitation for Suggestions From All Ireland

Dublin, Dec. 2.—The report through London, suggesting that the Irish Free State cabinet would resign and hand over the government to Eamon de Valera and his supporters, in the event of certain developments in connection with the Irish boundary commission, is ridiculed in well informed Free State circles.

LONDON PAPER'S STORY (Canadian Press) London, Dec. 2.—A sensational story concerning the possible effects in Southern Ireland of the dispute over the competence of the boundary commission, set up by the Anglo-Irish treaty, is published by the Daily Mail from its Dublin correspondent.

STUDENTS PROTEST CABINET'S ACTION Start Demonstration at News of Acceptance of British Demands

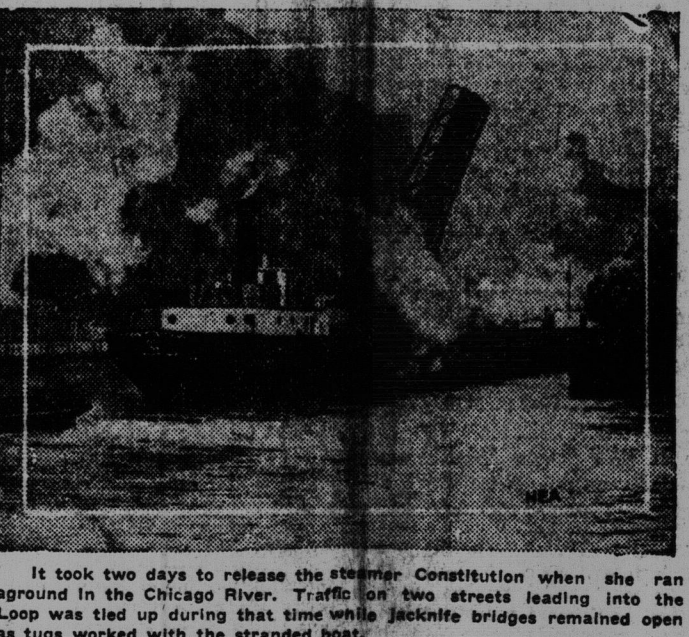
