### THE CHAMPION WILL DEFEND TITLE HERE

#### Russell Wheeler to Skate at National Meet in St. John

—Joe Moore Also Eligible.

—Track Experiments.

Russell Wheeler, the Canadian national skating champion, will be in St. John to defend his title this winter when here, it was learned yesterday by the Y. M. C. A., under whose auspices the biggest event of the year in Canadian skating will be held in St. John.

News of the lifting of ban of suspension which has been hanging over Joe Moore, another champion, also was received yesterday. Moore now eligible to compete in the Canadian national events here.

Those in charge of the United States national and the international championships were to meet this morning in Pittsburgh (Pa.) to set the dates for these events. The time fixed for the U. S. national and international championships will have some influence on the date to be fixed for the Canadian national.

A skating track, laid out on the same dimensions as those of the rink used for the Canadian national championships in Montreal last winter, will be laid out on the ice at Lily Lake today. The purpose of trying out the track is to give the local speedsters a chance to try it out. If as a result suggestions of possible ways of improving the shape and size of the rink are forthcoming these suggestions will be acted upon and changes made with a view to getting a track that is acceptable and that will enable the competitors to hit the fastest possible clip. The Montreal track was eight laps to the mile with 204-foot straightaways and semi-circular ends of seventy-four feet diameter.

#### STUFFY McINNIS RECORD.

First Sacker Made Only One Error Last Season.

Boston, Dec. 10.—"Stuffy" McInnis, the brilliant first baseman of the Boston Red Sox, made a most remarkable record last season.

Usually, when a player performs some unheard-of feat, it is heralded all over the States in big headlines. In many ways the record of McInnis was one of the most extraordinary feats ever performed in the major leagues, yet it has been given only one line of space in the newspapers.

Playing throughout the entire season, McInnis made only one error. Consider all the play that centres around first base. Recall the many difficult throws the first sacker has to handle. Forget the many plays the first baseman must take on ground balls.

Think over all those things and then remember that during the entire season McInnis made only one error, and you will have a fairly good idea of the magnitude of "Stuffy's" performance.

It was the irony of fate that McInnis should have made his only error in the city in which he made his first start, Philadelphia. It was also a tough break that caused the official scorer to record the play as an error. It was really a play that involved merely the judgment of the scorer. Generous scoring would have made it an easy matter to have entirely overlooked the play.

Here is the play that was the only blot on "Stuffy's" great record. Read it over and form your own opinion. No doubt you will express a regret that the scorer decided to give McInnis an error.

The scene was Philadelphia and the date May 30th, 1921. The error was recorded on a thrown ball. Jimmy Dykes was on first base, nobody out, and the score close. McInnis figured the batter was going to bunt, and went in on the pitch to make a play at second if possible.

The batter missed the ball. Jimmy Dykes, who had taken a big lead, seemed to be a sure out either at first or second. The moment the batter missed, "Stuffy" ran to first, watching Catcher Walters all the time. A perfect throw, properly handled by him would have gotten Dykes a couple of yards. Walters started his throw and then hesitated slightly.

This rather threw McInnis off his stride and he slipped slightly as he neared the bag. When Walters finally threw the ball, he floated it down to first rather than with his usual speed. A trifling off his balance, McInnis was forced to stretch for the ball and was unable to hold it. That enabled Dykes to get back to first in safety.

It seems the official scorer was of the opinion that Dykes was so far off the base when the throw was started that he would have been an easy out, had the ball been perfectly handled. He failed to take into consideration that Walters had once made a false start and that McInnis was off his balance when he received the ball.

It is a cinch the scorer would have overlooked the play entirely had he known it was to be the only thing that approached a misplay on the part of McInnis all year.

To me no record has ever been made in baseball that is more noteworthy than McInnis' stunt of playing an entire season at first base with only one error. And that was a questionable one.

Question of Falcons' Funds—

Amateurs and Pros in

Group Games.

Toronto, Dec. 10.—The 34th annual meeting here of the Amateur A. U. of Canada was so busy that it was not completed until after midnight. Among the more vital questions discussed was that of grants of \$2,000 and \$300 to the Falcon Hockey Club of Winnipeg by the province of Manitoba and the city of Winnipeg respectively when the Canadian champions took the trip to Antwerp where they won the world's hockey championship in 1920. The total in the club's treasury when it went to

Europe was \$3,705.60 and when they returned they had only \$33.33. In view of this, past President James G. Merriell, of the A. U. of C., and now a member of the Canadian Olympic Committee, roundly denounced what he described as "the cupidity of the players and made a motion that they be 'immediately expelled from amateur sport and instructed to return funds, illegitimately used, to the Canadian Olympic Committee.'"

After explanations by Claude Robinson of Winnipeg, who accompanied the Falcons on their trip, the motion was defeated and an amendment to it that the report of the statement of the Falcons be received, was passed.

An amendment suggested by the Alberta branch to permit the intermingling of amateur and professionals in group games called for a lengthy discussion in which a large number of the delegates took part. The eastern delegates opposed the amendment, which stood 70 to 30. Judge Jackson, of Leithbridge, was elected president.
