

Liner at Sand Point Has Fine

Lot of Newcomers for the Dominion.

With the ralling on her bow stove in, the large C. P. O. S. liner Melitoa, 14,000 tons, emerged out of a bank of fog this morning and docked at No. 2 and 3 berths, Sand Point. During her passage from Liverpool on March 11 with 1,489 passengers, comprising 466 cabin and 992 third class; 600 tons of general cargo and 508 bags of mail and 159 packages of parcle post.


