New York, July 2.—Jack Dempsey, world's heavyweight champion, is speeding to New York to force Georges Carpentier, French champion, to sign articles for a battle before the Frenchman leaves America.

Jack Kearns, wiring from Colorado on his trip to the Atlantic coast, says Dempsey is a boxing champion. He wants to hook up with the best man Europe ever had, and will not stop hounding him until a match is made. Kearns will arrive here for a conference, July 7.

Spectacle of a heavyweight champion actually challenging his challenger is a

new one in this crazy old world. It is a sensible bid for popularity, and, after all, boxing fans forgive and forget when they see a champion who is willing to meet them all.

So confident is Dempsey that he can defeat Carpentier that he is considering a show tour, meeting all comers on the road.

A big production company is eager to send Dempsey out on the circuit as soon as he is actually signed to meet Carpentier.

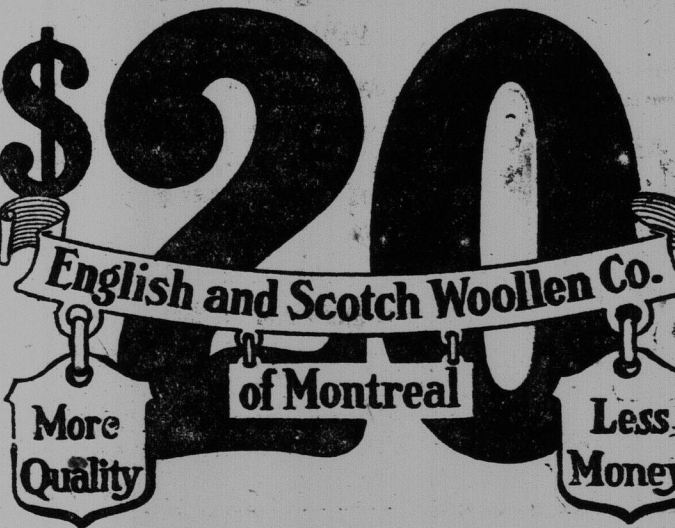
