FIRST EDITION. THE PIONEER SHIP.

ARRIVAL OF THE EXPRESS OF INDIA—RECEIVED THROUGH FROM JAPAN LOWERED.

A Fine Vessel With Easy Passenger Accommodations.

(Vanouver News Advertiser, April 18.)

Two stokers on the fine hull, the signal agreed upon, told the people of Victoria, shortly after 6 o'clock yesterday morning, that the steamer, the 'Empress of India,' was in sight, and in a very short time scores of persons could be seen hurrying towards the Outer Wharf. There could be seen the steamer lying about half a mile from the wharf, her white hull and fine lines standing out clearly in the early morning light, while the gun booms, which she was decked from stem to stern, waved in the breeze. The steamer's horns quickly started the health officers and customs officials aboard, and the Pilot also appeared with Mr. D. E. Brown, Mr. J. A. Fullerton, Mr. G. M. Brown, of the C. P. R., Mr. J. M. Rowell, Mr. Webster and Mr. Fagan, of the Vancouver Custom House; Mr. J. Wilson, of the C. P. R. Telegraph, and two or three other gentlemen, who had been invited to make the trip to Vancouver in the vessel. The two stokers themselves, carrying large numbers of the people of Victoria, who desired to see the vessel and her appointments.

Shortly after 8 o'clock Mayor Grant accompanied by some of the members of the City Council, adjourned to the saloon, where a number of the victims and passengers had assembled, and Captain Marshall of the Empress of India, the Mayor, on behalf of the citizens of Victoria, presented the steamer with a silver punch bowl and cups, which had been made expressly for the occasion, and made her a suitable inscription. Mayor Grant welcomed the vessel to Victoria, expressed his pleasure with which the exertions of the C. P. R. authorities to establish the steamship line had been witnessed and hoped that the result would be commercially successful. He concluded by wishing the ship, and her captain, officers and crew, every success in their future voyage.
