

Herewith enclosed Proceedings on the trials by District Courts-Martial of themarginally named soldiers, the findings and sentences having been confirmed by the Camp Commander, Petawawa Military Camp.

2. The same have been promulgated, extracts taken in accordance with the Regulations and minutes thereof endorsed on the backs of the pro-2. ceedings.

3. In the case of Gunner Yells, it will be noted that there was an adjournment from 15th August until 9th September, as is stated the proceedings, the Court adjourned to have the accused medically exami-ned and to have evidence of that examination available. The Medical Of-ficer examining the accused decided that he should be hospitalized for a period in order that proper observation could be carried out. The Cours re-convened upon the release from hospital of the accused.

4. In the case of Sapper McIntyre, the President of the Court re-quested that it be pointed out in this case that the accused was apprehended by a Lance-Corporal of the Provost Corps at Ferguslee, Ont., on 13thAugust, 1942. He was svidently taken to Renfrew Military Camp, and on the main line of the Railway leading to the Camp. However, the accu-sed was taken to Ottawa, and the Unit was advised that he was being held there for accurate the contained to be of the camp. there for escort. Therefore, the O.C., A-5, CRTC, CA, was obliged to and and excort to Ottawa to return this accused. In accordance withformer advice in this regard, the accused was charged with full charges, but it is considered that some remission might be granted.

In the case of Sapper Durrant, there are no comments. 5.
