Egypt a Protectorate

The step taken by Great Britain in declaring Egypt a British protectorate only legitimizes a condition already existing. It might have been taken many years ago, and probably would, but for the reluctance of the British government to disturb the very delicate balance between the various European nations, and between them and the Ottoman empire. When Turkey threw down the gauge of battle, all reason for reserve disappeared. It matters little what Germany may think, with her interests in the direction of Baghdad, for Germany is now an enemy, and the principal one. France, which formerly shared with England the dual control of Egypt, is now ally. So is Russia. Both have probably been consulted, and their compliance secured. On the break up of the Ottoman empire, both France and Russia will be well catered for.

Egypt does not become an integral part of the British empire. It will remain a British protectorate, still shedding the stagnated and mythical Turkish suzerainty. Abbas Hilmi, who has been so foolish as to cast in his lot with Turkey, is no longer the khedive, but another khedive has been appointed, who will 'know his place.' This khedive, as a matter of form, will be 'advised' by a British high commissioner, just as his predecessors were by Lord Cromer, Sir Eldon Gorst and Lord Kitchener. But to all intents and purposes, Egypt will be henceforth as much a part of the British empire as India, where there are still a number of shadowy protectorates, or British East Africa.

With Egypt and the Sudan in the north, British East Africa in the east, the Union of South Africa (along with what is now German Southwest Africa) in the south, and whatever she chooses to take in the west, Great Britain will soon have as much of the great African continent as she would care to undertake to administer. The white man's burden may become too heavy.

Mines Re-Opening

We understand that the Dominion Iron and Steel Company, which has been closed down practically since the outbreak of the war, will resume mining operations at Bell Island, this day week, January 4th.

We hear further that the mines will run in full swing, that is, engaging the regular complement of men, same as before war, and it is not unlikely that the mines will work on full time daily.—Telegram.
