The Council Agrees on The West Side Transfer

Matter of Conveyance of West End Land to Canadian Pacific Railway Agreed to -- Railway Company Undertakes to Develop -- A Rebuke for the Telegraph.

At a special meeting of the Common Council held yesterday afternoon, the result of the negotiations between the mayor and General Manager McNeill of the C.P.R. in regard to the draft of clause three of the West Side transfer agreement, was approved unanimously, and the mayor and common clerk authorized to execute the conveyance.

The Transfer Negotiations. The mayor said that without instructions from the council he had taken upon himself to write Mr. McNeill asking whether the C.P.R. would agree to filling in the land within ten years of the completion of the government work.

The mayor added that he had written Hon. William Pasley, who, on behalf of the government, had replied that the public works department would undertake to fill in the 400 foot strip along the heads of the docks.

On motion of Ald. Willet and Wigmore, the action of the mayor in moving in the matter was confirmed. Ald. Willet then moved that the draft of clause three, as proposed by the C.P.R., be adopted.

Accomplished Much by Delay. Ald. Scully stated that he had a good deal of criticism regarding the way this matter had dragged along, but that he had accomplished much by the delay.
