SPANIARDS HOLDING OUT. BARCELONA, Spain, April 19.—El Diario, enlarging the Spanish garrison, consisting of a captain, two lieutenants, a doctor and 48 men who had been defending the Baler against the Filipinos, says: "General Rios recently sent Captain Olmedo to order the garrison to evacuate, as Baler no longer belonged to Spain. Olmedo, after great difficulties, only got within 50 metres of the house in which the Spaniards were fortified. He managed, however, to deliver his instructions; but the garrison simply continued to fire from its fortified quarters and Captain Olmedo was compelled to return to Manila without reply."

MUSICAL BOYCOTT. CHICAGO, O., April 19.—The Musical Protective Association, a labor union organization, has decided to boycott the coming sangerfest in this city. No member of the association will be permitted to take part in the sangerfest. The reason given for this action is that non-union labor has been employed in the erection of the sangerfest building; that the Thomas orchestra, not a member of the association, has been engaged for the fest and that the executive committee of the fest had disregarded provisions of the association to furnish union men.

LEONARD KELLY'S DEATH. STANLEY, April 17.—The death of Mr. Leonard Kelly, an old and highly respected resident of this place occurred this morning at 8 o'clock. Mr. Kelly was born at Kings Cove, York county, on the 18th day of December, 1810, and was therefore in the 89th year of his age. He was the youngest son of Mr. John Kelly, a United Empire Loyalist, who came from North Carolina in 1783, and was therefore the first of his name in the county. He was married to Miss McKay of Nashville, who survives him. Besides Mr. Kelly he leaves eight sons to mourn the loss of a kind husband and father.

ICE IN THE ST. LAWRENCE. MONTEAL, April 19.—There is considerable apprehension in the vicinity of the river front which will not be removed until the ice jam below the city breaks away. The ice just below Maisonneuve, and for several miles below that point, appears to be as solid as in mid-winter and the ice that has moved down from above Montreal is piled high at this point. The river in front of the city is very high being barely six inches from the top of the retaining wall, especially constructed to prevent the spring floods. Should the balance of the St. Louis and St. Francis Lake ice come down before the jam breaks at Maisonneuve, the probability is that there will be a flood and considerable damage done to the low lying sections of the city.
