"IN THE DAY'S NEWS."
Congressman Claude Kitchin, who urges a big increase in the income tax rate on the corporations if the excess profits taxes are done away with, is the ranking Democrat of the House Ways and Means Committee, and was head of that body when the excess profits method was instituted. Mr. Kitchin has represented the Second North Carolina district at Washington, since 1911. Educated at Wake Forest college, the cultural mother of so many sons of North Carolina, young Kitchin, in 1901, turned to the law as a calling; and within a decade had won rank as a thinker and orator such as to induce his neighbors to send him to Congress, when he has remained, showing ability as a parliamentary leader and debater, which ability was duly recognized several years ago when he was made floor leader of the Democratic party in the House.
