HILL, *Hon.* GEORGE FREDERICK.

S. of the late Hon. George S. Hill, barrister, who was for twenty-eight years a mem. of the Assem. and L.C. of N.B. B. at St. Stephen, Feb. 1832. Ed. there and in U.S. Admitted an attorney in 1854. Went into mercantile pursuits same year and has therein continued ever since. Was Official Assignee in bankruptcy for Charlotte Co. from 1869 until June, 1878. Sat for Charlotte in Leg. Assem., N.B., in 1865, and was defeated at the election in 1866, when Confederation was carried. Re-elected and sat from g.e. 1878 until apptd. to L.C., 25 May, 1882. Apptd. Speaker of L.C., 3 March, 1887. A Liberal.—*St. Stephen, N.B.*

HOLLY, JAMES.

Descended from a U.E. Loyalist family. B. at Burton, Co. Sunbury, N.B., 24 Oct., 1835, and ed. there. M., Aramanth Agnes, dau. of Alexander Barnhill, Esq., of Lancaster, N.B. Is a surveyor and dealer in lumber. Presdt. of the South Bay Boom Co., and Eminent Preceptor of Union De Molai, Preceptory of Knights Templar. Has been a mem. of the City Council and municipality of the City and Co. of St. John. Apptd. to L.C., 23 Feb., 1883. A Liberal.—*Portland, St. John, N.B.*

JONES, THOMAS ROSENELLE.

Family among the earliest settlers in N.B. and on maternal side were Loyalists. S. of the late John Jones, Esq., of St. John, N.B. B. in St. John, 12 Sept., 1825, and ed. there. M., Mary, eldest dau. of Charles Doney, Esq., of St. John, N.B. A wholesale dry goods merchant. Was a dir. of the Consolidated E. & N. A. Railway, for extension westward; and chief promoter of the St. John Cantilever Bridge and Railway Extension Co., and various other public works. Has been Presdt. of the St. John Board of Trade, and an Alderman of St. John. Was a mem. of the Ex. Council and a Presdt. of that body. from 25 Feb. to 23 June, 1871. Apptd. to L.C. 12 Jan. 1869.
