

Shoppers urged to think local

Forty years ago in the Times, electors of the village of Port Credit were given the opportunity to decide the two-year term issues for themselves when they elected their village council. The question "Are you in favor as a wartime measure, under the Local Government Extension Act, 1940, of the municipal council elected for 1941 holding office for a term of two years?" was asked of each voter who was advised to seriously consider the matter before voting. Christmas shoppers were asked to reserve their business for local shops as opposed to Toronto stores. Prices were said to "compare advantageously with prices in city stores." Canadians' contribution to the war effort kept on rolling full force as residents were asked to save scrap metal for reprocessing into war products; students at Port Credit High School ended their war stamp selling contest with \$2,924 worth of sold certificates; a "mile of pennies" was to be held in Port Credit to raise money to send parcels to the men overseas. Included in the packages were gum, candy, cigarettes, cookies and Christmas cakes. The Times, plus any three of the following magazines, was offered for only \$2.50; Maclean's, Chatelaine, Rod and Gun, American Fruit Grower, Canada Poultry Review, American Girl and American Boy. The subscriptions for the four publications were for one year.
