Under Section 4, Chapter 81, R.S.C., the Superintendent General of Indian Affairs has the control and management of Indians in Canada and by subsection 2, of Section 27, of the said Chapter, the Superintendent General may when there are minor children appoint a fit and proper person to take charge of such children and their property. No guardian has, however, been appointed for these children. They are being educated at the expense of the Government at the Mount Elgin Institute in the county of Middlesex, province of Ontario.
