The Department is in receipt of a communication from Mr. [unclear] of the [unclear] Agency in reference to three boys, the one of the name [unclear] of the [unclear] [unclear], who was placed in the Brandon Industrial School in 1915. An extract from the Agent's letter regarding this matter is enclosed herewith.

The Department would like to have a report from you concerning the care of these children. It is considered that the boy who is in delicate health and, in the Agent's opinion, not a fit pupil for a boarding school should be discharged and allowed to remain at home, while the other boy, [unclear] by name, should be placed in a school nearer home.
