- (5) "Civil Aviation".
- (6) "Resumption of International Trade".

  In connection with this paper, attention is called to the "Trade Notes" included in Appendix D.
- (7) "Canadian Interest in Regulation of Japanese Fishing."
- (8) "Regulation of Japanese Whaling Activities".
- (9) "Control of Narcotic Drugs".

In connection with all the above papers, attention is called to paragraphs 22-35 of the paper "Military Aspects", and paragraph 1 (c) of the letter of the Chiefs of Staff dated August 7.

- 6. Reparations: Three papers are included under this general heading:
  - (1) "Reparations".
  - (2) "Restitution and the Protection of Property, Rights and Interests".
  - (3) "Canadian Life Insurance Interests".
- 7. Political Provisions: The main brief contains a very short memorandum on this subject. In addition, attention is called to items 3, 5 and 6 in Appendix D. The paper on "War Crimes" may be useful under this heading.
- 8. Machinery for Securing the Achievement of Basic
  Objectives of the Allied Powers: The main brief contains no single memorandum devoted to this subject. Relevant material is contained in the following places:

  - (2) "Economic Demilitarization and Economic Control", paragraphs 16-37.

- 9. Form of the Peace Settlement: whether a single instrument or more: This subject is duscussed briefly in the paper "Procedure", paragraphs 38-40.
