

I believe I said to Matthews that I had got the articles from Sergeant Rous. A week or so later Matthews told me he had some more clothing if I wanted it, and I agreed to buy some. I went with him to his lorry which he had been driving and in the back there was a light green painted trunk.

Before this incident I had seen Matthews at the ~~Chelms~~^{Chelms} garage where he brought me a windbreaker jacket and one pair of brown lace shoes. He brought this to me as I had told him I could do with it. I paid him $\frac{1}{2}$ for these two articles.

About the same date Corporal Amor of the Crickwood garage, telephoned me at Chelms and asked me if I wanted a pair of shoes and one pair of trousers. I said "Yes" and he sent them to me by a lorry that came to the garage. I gave him $\frac{1}{2}$ for the two articles when I saw him later.

I now want to refer to the lorry incident mentioned above. When I went to the lorry and saw that it contained a trunk, I was with Privates Matthews and Timleck. As I have already said Matthews had told me that if I wanted anymore clothing he had some. At the lorry Timleck suggested that I should call at his address at 26 Reesdale Street later that evening where I could collect any clothing I selected from the trunk. I later went to this address with Matthews and Timleck, and I there selected the following property from the trunk. 2 shirts, 2 pair under pants, 3 vests, 3 pair of socks, 4 handkerchiefs, 2 pair of trousers, 2 neckties, 1 tube of shaving cream and one web belt. I paid nothing for this property, as it was understood to be a stone out between the three of us. I sold one of the shirts for 10/- to another private, and I also ~~paid~~ sold
