PROSECUTION: 2nd Witness: H. 59089, Pte. McDonald, H.E., 3 Coy., Cdn. Provost Corps, sworn, states.

Swore Examined by Prosecutor:

Q.1 On evening of 3 Feb 1944 where were you on duty?

A.1 At the CALCURRA CROSS ROADS in LANCIANO. It is the main cross roads just outside LANCIANO.

Q.2 Will you relate the story of what happened there that evening?

A.2 At approximately 2000 hours 3 Feb 1944 I was on point duty at LANCIANO. A 15 Cwt. drove up to my corner and asked directions to BARI. I was unable to tell him the best route to take. An Armoured Corps Officer standing close by gave him the information. Shortly after the truck left I heard a crash approximately 200 yards down the road towards ROCCA. I went to the scene of the accident. When I arrived there I found one man lying on the ground. I stopped a truck and asked the driver to bring the injured man to the Hospital. He said he would and we put him on the truck. There were English soldiers there who put another injured man on the truck. The driver of the 15 Cwt. did not appear to be injured. I then brought the injured to the Hospital. I summoned L/CPL. Davies, who investigated the accident. I took no particulars.

Q.3 Do you recognize the accused?

A.3 Yes, he is the driver of the 15 Cwt.

Cross Examined by Defending Officer:

Q.1 When accused/you ^{asked} directions did he appear drunk?

A.1 I could not say.

Q.2 Was he travelling slowly?

A.2 Yes.

Q.3 When accused asked directions to BARI did he also ask directions to other places?

A.3 It is possible.
