

Raphael has now an opportunity to work for the Industrial Timber Mills, Camp 6, at Youbou, B.C. as a chokerman. In view of the fact that the above company are very short of this type of labour I would respectfully recommend that representation be made on Raphael's behalf in order to obtain for him a postponement of his military training.
