This very clear and detailed map of China on which the boundaries of the eighteen-provinces, the capitals, chief towns, canals, rivers and chief mountain ranger are plainly marked, is worth preserving for reference during the present troubles. A great many of the places where mission stations are established are included. Pekin, or Peking, and Tientsin, in the northern Province of Chihli or Peh-chili, are clearly marked. The Gulf of Peh-chili is traversed by the dispatch boat of the fleets carrying reports from Tientsin to Chifu. Chifu, in Shantung Province, an open port, where the admiralty ships of the foreign navies are stationed, and from whence comes most of our news, is the Chefeo shown on the map—a merely different spelling of the same name. Nanking, the capital of Kiangnan, principality, on the Yanktse river, is in the Province of Kiangsu, on the coast of the Yellow Sea, and Shanghai, the paradise of the news fakirs, is on the coast, in the same province. Canton, the capital of the principality of Liangkwong, whose viceroy is Li Hung Chang, is on the West river, in the province of Kwengtung, and Hongkong, the British seaport, is just off the coast of the same province, at the mouth of the river.
