EXPORT BUTTER AND CHEESE

Montreal, Saturday, Nov. 9.—The market for cheese this week has remained steady, with prices practically unchanged.

Colours are still commanding a premium over white cheese, and this is largely due to the fact that the demand to supply the western trade is still continuing for orders in for shipment to that part of the country. The difference in value this week was fully 1 1/2c a pound. We to 12 1/2c the price paid for white, and 12 1/2c to 12 5/8c being the current price for colored. Most of the factories have closed for the season, and most of the country boards have also adjourned, and there are only two or three that will handle next week. Fleetville, Brookville next week, one or two others.

The receipts are dropping off rapidly. Montreal amounted to barely 40,000 boxes. The shipments were fairly heavy, but were stocks are rather smaller than they were a week ago, and there is no doubt that there will be more held over for shipment during the winter months than there was last year.

The market for butter is steady, and prices are the same as were current a week ago. The market for Pennsylvania butter has quieted at 30 1/2c to 31c a pound, with undertakes at 29c to 30c. There is a large quantity of New Zealand butter held on contract to be delivered throughout the winter months at prices ranging from 30 1/2c to 31c. The total shipments each week aggregate 8 to 10 car-loads.

QUEBEC HOLSTEINS FOR AUSTRALIA

That the district of Beauharnois, Quebec, is celebrated for its live stock cannot be denied. Shipments have been made to both South Africa and Japan. Probably all records for long distance shipment were broken, however, last week. Jack Tannahill shipped 100 head of registered Holsteins consigned to Melbourne, Australia. Five of them were from Mr. Tannahill's own herd, one from George E. Ripley, two from P. J. Sallee, of Lachine Rapids.

The shipment consisted of six yearling heifers, one cow and three young bulls. The order for these cattle came through Mr. Carruthers, of Berkeley, Ontario, who took charge of them at Montreal, where they were put on the steamer.
