ing the trade. Receipts of fresh eggs are in normal quantities as compared with other years. On this market new-laid eggs are quoted as follows: Grade A, extra, 35c to 36c; No. 1 storage, 30c to 31c; and No. 2, 25c to 26c. Montreal new-laid eggs are quoted 60c to 62c; fresh receipts, 40c to 45c; selected, 55c; No. 1 storage, 30c; and No. 2 storage, 28c. The price in the country is 26c. Old, fine, round, 110 to 115 1/2 to 150 1/2 dressed.

Butter exports to the Old Lead are impossible on account of prices here and there. The prairie provinces seem to have wrestled the Vancouver market from us. And yet the market remains in firm tones. Receipts have fallen off and the quality is not of the finest. On this market fresh creamery prints are quoted 35c to 36c; solids, 55c to 56c; dairy prints, 28c to 30c; and bakers' 24c to 25c. At Montreal fresh butter is quoted 34c to 35c, and for the very best grades, higher quotations are expected. The cheese market is decidedly strong. At Montreal, Easterns are quoted 17 1/2c, and Westerns are held at 15 1/2c and 15 3/4c is now making.

LIVE STOCK
The demand was stronger and the supplies smaller on the live stock market this last week. Drivers seem to be holding back shipments awaiting higher prices, which now average as follows: 80; butcher's cattle, good, \$7.15 to \$7.65; corn, to meal, \$5.15 to \$7.15; hogs, \$5.75 to \$7.25; choice cows, \$6.35 to \$7; com, to rood, \$4 to \$5.25; feeders, \$5 to \$6.75; stockers, \$4.75 to \$6.50; canners and cutters, \$5 to \$4.50. Choice milk cows bring \$20 to \$25; medium quality, \$15 to \$20; calves, \$4.50 to \$10.50. Small meats continue in strong demand. Spring lambs, ewt., \$10.00 to \$11.75; cull lambs, \$7.75; rising sheep, \$8 to \$9; light ewes, \$7 to \$8.25; heavy and bucks, \$6 to \$7; culls, \$3 to \$4.50. Offerings of hogs have been fairly liberal and the market is easy in proportion. Fed and watered they are quoted \$9.50 to \$9.60; light and water, \$9 to \$9.25; 100 lb. country points, \$7.25 to \$9.25; sows, fed and watered, \$7 to \$7.25.
