The matter of steam subsidization for the West India Service, and the inclusion therein of Lunenburg as a regular port of call, together with that of the dredging of the Harbor referred to in the Presidents report, was vigorously discussed, and arrangements made for an early presentation to the Federal Government, of Lunenburg's claims in these connections.

It was arranged in connection with the above, also that an effort will be made for extension of the D. A. R.'s New York Steamship service to this port, for the purposes of direct fish shipments to New York, and of affording Annapolis Valley, and other producers via Lunenburg, a shorter rail route for their shipments abroad, than that to Halifax.

The utter injustices to Lunenburg appearing in the arrangement of the Halifax & S. Shore Ry. time table whereby passengers to the town from Halifax, are to be kept waiting at Mahone for a couple of hours and often for a much longer time, pending the often times tardy arrival there of the Middleton train, was freely discussed and commented upon, along with other objectionable features of the present service.

An indignation meeting of the Ratepayers of the Town was decided upon as the best position for action, and the following Resolution passed unanimously.

A copy of which Resolutions are thereupon placed in the Mayor's hands.
