PIDGEEON INQUEST

The Coroner's Jury on the inquest into the cause of the death of the late John Pidgeon, who came to his death while out shooting ducks at Bear Creek with a companion, Simon Thibodeau, Jr., brought in a verdict last evening "that the late Mr. Pidgeon came to his death from a gun shot wound on the afternoon of Oct. 25, 1904, and that according to the evidence we don't know where the shot came from."

This inquest, which has been held for two days and one night, was just concluded last night and, as can be seen from the verdict, no definite conclusion was arrived at as to how Pidgeon came to his death. H. D. Smith, Crown Attorney, was present during the first day and since then A. B. Carscallen has been looking after the Crown part of the inquest.

About twenty witnesses in all were examined by Coroner Mitchell, including J. F. Saint, Nelson Sturdevant, Wm. John Kelly, Simon Thibodeau, John Pidgeon, father of deceased, Chas. S. Benn, Simon Thibodeau, Jr., Robert Southgate, James Sutherland, Mr. Stonehouse, Dr. W. W. Hay, Henry Labadie, Wm. McDonald, James Thibodeau, John Grayson, Geo. McLaren, Isadore Lozon, and others.

Simon Thibodeau, the young man who was with Pidgeon at the time the accident happened, was, according to his story, sitting in the front of the boat with Pidgeon behind him. He saw a duck in front of him and fired. About the same time Pidgeon fired and Thibodeau turning around in the boat saw that Pidgeon had shot himself.

The case was a long one and much complicated and, according to the evidence no other verdict could be brought in.

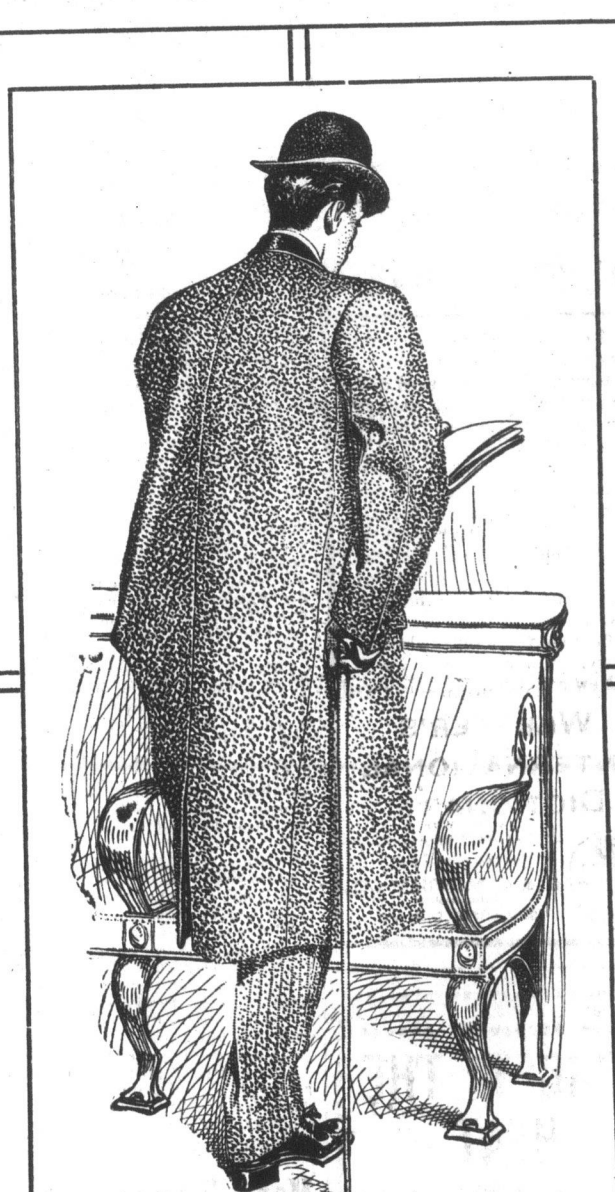
New Bishop of Nova Scotia.
