## FRENCH AVIATORS DROP MANY BOMBS

Paris, Aug. 27—French aviators continue their activities against certain positions in possession of the Germans in the eastern portions of the western front, according to an announcement made today by the war office.

Part of the text of the statement follows:

"During the night of August 26 our aviators bombarded St. Bausant and Essey, in the Woivre district. In the Argonne section the railroad stations at Ivroy and Clerges also were bombarded by the French aeroplanes. This followed an attempt on the part of the German aviators on Clermont en Argonne. The bombs thrown down on this position, however, by the Germans caused no damage.

"During the night of August 26-27 a French aviator threw down ten shells on a factory at Dornach, where the Germans have been manufacturing asphyxiating gas.

"During the morning of today a French squadron of aeroplanes bomb-

divided the railroad station and the electric power house at Muelheim, in the Grand Duchy of Baden.

"All the aviators returned unharmed."

The statement also told of the capture of a long line of German trenches on the crest between Sondernach and Landersbach, in the Vosges, and the repulse of the Germans when they attempted to retake the positions.

"In the Champagne district a German reconnaissance was repulsed," the statement said.

"In the Argonne mines were exploded by both sides, the advantage being gained by us."

Amsterdam, Aug. 27—Advices received here today from Berlin say that 100,000 soldiers have been transferred from the eastern to the western front. Their objective is Verdun.

## Synopsis of Coal Mining Regulations.

Coal mining right of the Dominion in Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, the Yukon Territory, the Northwest Territories and in a portion of the Province of British Columbia may be leased for a term of twenty-one years at an annual rental of \$1. an acre. Not more than 2,500 acres will be leased to one applicant. Applications for a lease must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-agent in the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

In surveyed territory the land must be described by sections, or legal subdivisions of sections, and in an unsurveyed territory the tract applied for shall be staked out by the applicant himself.

Each application must be accompanied by a fee of \$5 which will be refunded if the rights applied for are not available, but not otherwise. A royalty shall be paid on the marketable output of the mine at the rate of five cents per ton.

The person operating the mine shall furnish the agent with sworn returns accounting for the full quantity of marketable coal mined and pay the royalty thereon. If the coal must be made by the applicant in person to the Agent or Sub-agent in the district in which the rights applied for are situated.

The lease will include the coal mining rights only, but the lessee may be permitted to purchase whatever available surface rights may be considered necessary for the working of the mine at the rate of \$10.00 an acre.

For full information application should be made to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, or to any Agent or sub-agent of Dominion Lands.

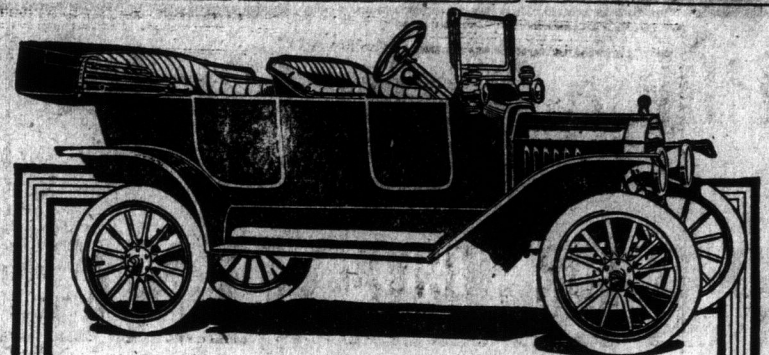
