## "Sentenced to Death."

A TRUE STORY OF CRUEL OPPRESSION AND BARBAROUS MISRE.

The number of families evicted in Ireland during the last quarter was 1213, representing 6139 persons, says a late number of the *United Ireland*. Of these only 47 families were admitted as tenants, and 569 as caretakers, which, therefore, left only 599 families, or 3021 persons to seek the "charity" of the workhouse, or to starve and die the death of dogs. We are wrong there. A dog is usually well fed and fed, and if circumstances demand his destruction, the halter, a dose of strychnine or a charge of hot quickly puts an end to his career.
