NEW YORK, Nov. 5. Democratic Governors were elected yesterday in each State in which his office was filled. In Massachussets, New Jersey, Virginia and, with he exception of New York State, where the Tammany democracy was ebuked, more democracy than reublican victories were recorded at he polls. Maryland elected a demoratic State Senator, and of four ongressmen three democrats were lected. The exception was C. D. Paige for the third district of Massausetts. In Massachusetts there was a democratic landslide. Lieut. overnor Walsh was chosen Govern The State plurality was 53,691, he largest ever given a democratic andidate for office. Walsh carried with him into office every democratic andidate on the State ticket with he possible exception of the Attorney General. The Tammany democracy in New York State was condemned in a manner which left lit-

Mitchell, Fusionist, was elected Mayor of New York, leading Edward Mc-Call, the Tammany candidate, by 121,209 votes. Sulzer, the deposed lovernor of the State, was returned the Assembly from New York ity. The New York assembly will e safely republican. In New Jersey, Fielder, democrat, was elected Governor with, 22,000 plurality over the republican candidate. The democrats will control both houses of the

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Nov. 5. Reports received here from Port u Prince indicate a revolt against Orestes, which has been brewing in Haiti for several months, and which next month. Delegates of the Government in the North have resigned and troops have been sent to keep order there. There have been clashes between the revolutionists and the Government soldiers in the capital, and firing is heard every night on the outskirts of Port au Prince The President is surrounded by a heavy guard whenever he appears in public. It is reported that the date of the Revolution has been set for the beginning of December. Foreigners are getting ready to flee, and several refugees have arrived at

MELUM, France, Nov. 5. Sixteen bodies have been taken from the burned and splintered coaches of the Marseilles-Paris Exevening. It is believed that severa nore bodies are still among th wreckage. The corpses were badly urned and almost unrecognizable Nine of the dead were Governmen clerks. Two others were a French nfantry Captain and his wife. An ther was a prominent merchant of Lycns. Thirteen were seriously ourt and others badly shaken.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 5. The Scout cruiser Chester, at the Philadelphia Navy Yards was order ed to-day to prepare to sail for Vera Cruz immediately. The Chester is not a fighting ship, but is swift and valuable for scout duty. Of lighter draught than the big warships now at Vera Cruz, she will be able to join
