

Special measures are to be taken to prevent copies of the treatise falling into the hands of any of the Allies, but it is not surprising to learn that the claim is urged that bombs were invented by a Prussian. That they were first employed in Germany as far back as the sixteenth century would seem to be capable of assertion, but the inventor was certainly not a Prussian. As to whether the Kaiser possesses a sufficiency of personal knowledge of the intricacies of the subject to write a treatise concerning it which would pass muster among experts is equally a matter of doubt; but the possession of a technical and literary "ghost" is far from unknown to alleged Royal and Imperial authors.
