TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

FRANCE MUST PROTECT HERSELF.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 22.—An emotional plea for national security, pronounced by Premier Briand, France informed the armament conference yesterday that however deeply she might be moved by the call to lighten the burden of armament, she dared not destroy the effectiveness of her army, so long as the situation in Europe remained as it is. With all the dynamic force of his eloquence, the strong man of France held the rapid attention of the conference for an hour, as he recounted the people. Briand declared that the old imperialistic party of Germany still was covertly teaching a religion of war, and hoping to turn to its advantage at the very door of France, seven millions of men trained in arms, while beyond lay Bolshevik Russia, with her millions stirring in unrest, whose final course no one could predict. When Briand concluded, Arthur Balfour responded for Britain, with a virtual pledge of British support, should the civilization of Europe be again threatened as it was in 1914. Secretary Hughes, for the United States, declared the plea of France would never fall on deaf ears in America and Italy and Belgium added a word of appreciation for the peculiar situation of France. Admiral Kato for Japan, expressed profound sympathy with the declaration of the French Premier, and added "Japan herself desired to maintain on land only such military forces as seemed necessary for national security and the maintenance of order within."

The Attention of Ship Owners is called to the following

REGULATIONS

Relating to the Examination of Engineers (Chapter 1).

GENERAL RULES.

1. These Regulations are issued in pursuance of an Act respecting the qualification of Engineers (6 Edward VII., Chap. 24).

In accordance with Section 9 of the said Act "No steamers registered in Newfoundland shall go to sea from any port in or of Newfoundland or its dependencies unless the engineers thereof have obtained and possess valid certificates for sea-going ships, appropriate to their several stations in such ships, or of a higher grade from the Board of Trade in the United Kingdom, or valid certificates of competency appropriate to their several stations in such ships, or of a higher grade granted in any British possession, and declared by Order of His Majesty in Council, published in the "London Gazette" under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping (Colonial) Act, eighteen hundred and sixty-nine, or of any Act of the Parliament of the United Kingdom containing such provisions, to be of the same force as certificates of competency for foreign-going ships granted under the Acts of the Parliament of the United Kingdom relating to merchant shipping, or a certificate of competency under the provisions of this Act. And every person who, having been engaged to serve as an Engineer of any sea-going ship, as aforesaid, without first ascertaining that he at the time is entitled to, and possessed of such certificates, shall for such offence incur a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.
